What is Y-FED ?

Y-FED is a European and international event that will bring together 120 young people from 43 different nationalities to participate in a **simulation of a federal European Union**.

During 6 days, the participants will each have a role (MP, senator, journalist, lobbyist), that they will play in a **reinvented European Union**. This will include a European Government, as well as a European Parliament, composed of a Chamber of European Citizens and a European Senate,

Who is participating ?

From 16 to 30 years old, **participants come from all over the European continent** and beyond. They were recruited on their motivation, and many have already been active in civil society organizations.

Where will it take place ?

The Y-FED will take place from June 11 to 14 in **Strasbourg** (France), then from June 14 to 16 in **Ortenberg** (Germany).

In Strasbourg, we will be at the University Palace, and in Ortenberg we will be at the castle of the same name.

What is the aim of Y-FED ?

The aim of the Y-FED is to **enable young people to imagine the future of Europe** by participating for the first time in a simulation of a European Union.

This project seeks to show what a European Federation could look like, bringing European citizens and states closer together.

Y-FED is organized by **Young Europeans - Strasbourg** and **France**.
